#### Woy Woy Peninsula Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan

In 2010 Central Coast Council completed a Flood Study for the Woy Woy Peninsula. The study identified flood risks to people, property, infrastructure and assets. The study provided Council with a better understanding of the importance of the interaction of coastal inundation, groundwater conditions and the increasing effects of development on flood behaviour due the changing hydraulics of the existing terrain surface.

Council, with the assistance of state and federal government, is now undertaking a Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan (FRMSP) for Woy Woy Peninsula including Kahibah Creek catchment to look at ways to manage flood risk.



More than 10,000 properties within the study area could be affected by flooding in extreme ocean and rainfall events.



Council is asking the community what flood risks they area concerned about and how they would like Council to address the risks



At Council we know some parts of the Local Government Area (LGA) are more prone to flooding than others and we're committed to finding solutions to reduce the social and economic damages of flooding.

A Flood Study was completed for Woy Woy Peninsula in 2010 and the Brisbane Water Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan was completed in 2015.

The Woy Woy Peninsula is prone to nuisance flooding, especially from long-duration rainfall events. Flooding occurs in the road reserves and in private property, where it remains until it infiltrates or evaporates. Generally, this flooding may remain for a couple of days. However, during very wet periods the groundwater table can rise such that flooding remains for several weeks.

Flooding is also caused by creek flooding during large rainfall events, as well as inundation from ocean storms.

This Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan will be looking at options to manage flooding and its consequences. This may include drainage upgrades, foreshore barriers, raising roads, property filling, drainage easements, planning and development controls, community awareness programs or evacuation procedures.

Council will be identifying potential options with the input from the community and will then assess the options and identify what actions Council, SES and the community can undertake to improve flood risk.
